The remaining 20% will be determined by your class participation.

Late papers will be docked a grade per day (e.g., B+ to B) unless you have received approval ahead of time.

The plan is to meet in person on Thursdays (except in Week 1), with the exact location to be announced. All other meetings will be synchronous over Zoom. The default expectation for Zoom meetings is that you should be actively engaged, with camera on. If you require an exception, reach out to me and let me know. The meeting format for Thursdays may change as the quarter proceeds.
